Work continues on garage/Welcome Center project



Work continues to repurpose the garage attached to the historic Glidden Homestead into a Welcome & Education Center.

Water and plumbing lines were dug and connected (pictured at left) as part of the project to provide for a handicapped-accessible restroom. Roofing work also has been completed. Work will continue this winter, with planned unveiling of the new space at the May Open House/Open Barn event

The repurposed garage will become the central entrance to the museum and house the Homestead office and Gift Shop, as well as meeting space.
